

SUM DELHI 2006 INFORMATION SHEET

DATES: Jan 16th - 7th April, 2006
LOCATION: YWAM Bangalore, Bangalore, India
LANGUAGES: English, Korean
SCHOOL LEADER: Aldrin Bogi

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Completion of a YWAM/U of N DTS/CDTS including outreach
2. Presently serving in a campus ministry leadership role within YWAM/U of N, or a young person with recognized call to minister to students
3. Long-term call to YWAM/U of N
4. Recommendation from YWAM/U of N leader with direct oversight of applicant

COSTS: It is our hearts' desire to make the SUM financially accessible to those from weaker economies, but at the same time act justly in regard to those from nations with stronger economies. In order to move in this direction, we are following a three-tiered fee Scale developed by the Field-based Leadership Training School, based on the current PCI (per-capita income) for a country in relation to the other nations of the world. (To understand the Biblical basis for the International Financial Scale, see page 171 of the U of N 2000 Reference Guide and/or Chapter 4 of "Principles Made Practical: A Handbook for Pioneering U of N Courses.") Each individual's SUM fees will be assessed according to his/her nation of citizenship, because it is generally assumed that this is the relational root system from which they receive support. Therefore, if a husband and wife are citizens of different nations which fall in different fee categories, they will pay different fees. The fees charged for Category C go in their entirety toward food and accommodation. The higher fees collected from individuals in Categories A and B will help to cover costs for SUM handouts, supplies, equipment, transport, etc. for the entire student body. (In order to keep the participant costs this low, some of the SUM speakers have agreed to cover their own travel expenses and forego receiving an honorarium as their gift toward investing in leaders from the developing world.)

The SUM student tuition fees will be as follows:

*Category C	USD \$200
Category B	USD \$600
Category A	USD \$800
Category A working in Cat C nations:	USD \$600
Cat B working in Cat C Nations:	USD \$ 400

The PCI is computed by drawing current information (2002) from several published sources and averaging the figures. Applicants will be will notified as to which category their nation falls within when their letter of acceptance is sent.

STUDENT BODY PERCENTAGES: We have set some percentages for accepting students in order to keep a balance of those from the host regions and individuals coming from other parts of the world. The constituency of the school will be very international in terms of the student body, staff and speakers.

Our desire is to see groups of two to three campus ministry staff come together from their base or area, if at all possible. This has great value in making people feel secure, providing opportunity for teams to discuss together their insights while they are in the midst of the learning environment, and helping people implement what they've discovered once they

return home.

MULTI-NATIONAL STAFF: We believe this SUM will have approximately 25 students. In addition to having corporate classroom sessions all together, we will break the school into small groups. Each Small Group of 4-7 students will have its own leader and staff and will meet together from time-to-time to process what they are learning in the classroom as well as engage in other Small Group activities.

SCHEDULE & ATTENDANCE: The schedule will be full and at times very demanding. We ask that students come with the least amount of outside responsibilities so that they can get the most out of the SUM opportunity. There will be a balance between classroom lectures, discussion groups, work duties, social activities and personal time. In addition to working on the Campus Project, there will be periodic exams and required reading to reinforce the learning process.

Because this is a school for campus ministry staff and leaders, we often receive very legitimate requests for students to be absent from class to lead or participate in ministry opportunities. However, if we granted these requests, the continuity of school would quickly unravel. In order to protect the individual student and to protect the integrity of the school, WE DO NOT ALLOW ABSENCES FROM THE SUM CLASS TIMES FOR ANY REASON OTHER THAN ILLNESS. Participants are expected to arrive in time for the start of the school (by Jan 14th), to stay through the close of the school (departing NO EARLIER than April 7) and to be present at all SUM class activities each week. There are a few required weeknight and weekend events during the SUM, and these will be communicated at the outset of the school. Otherwise, evenings, Saturdays and Sundays are free for optional sessions, ministry or personal time. The SUM is a University of the Nations course worth 12 credits.
